A Report on NSS Special Camp 2025–2026

The NSS Unit of Asannagar Madan Mohan Tarkalankar College organised a seven-day Special Camp at its adopted village, Das Para, Asannagar, Nadia, from 8 April to April 14, 2026. The programme focused on community service, health awareness, cleanliness, youth development and social responsibility, consistent with the objectives of NSS Special Camping.

Report on Day 1 – 08 April 2026, Wednesday

Inauguration and Orientation

The inaugural day of the NSS Special Camp-2025-26 organized by NSS Unit, Asannagar MMT College, Nadia, was successfully conducted on April 8, 2026. The day's activities began with registration of the volunteers, after that all the volunteers assembled with command of NSS clap and hosting the NSS flag by Dr. Biswajit Podder, TIC, Asannagar MMT College. The inauguration ceremony was started through felicitation. After the felicitation programme was over the TIC and NSS Programme Officer delivered speeches and highlighting the importance, code of conduct, and objectives of the NSS Special Camp activities.

The first day of the Special Camp commenced with registration of NSS volunteers followed by a cleanliness drive at the camp site.

The inaugural session was followed by an informative session on “Service and Humanity in Swami Vivekananda’s Ideas”, conducted by resource persons Mr. Soumen Paul. The session highlighted the values of service, humanity and social responsibility.

An introductory session was also conducted on the objectives of the camp, responsibilities of volunteers and the NSS Code of Conduct. The day concluded with practice for cultural programmes to be presented as part of the community outreach activities.

Report on Day 2 – 09 April 2026, Thursday

The second day's activities began with the NSS Flag Hoisting ceremony by Sri Uttam Kr. Barman, SACT, Dept. of Physical Education. After the Flag Hoisting ceremony, a Swachhata Abhiyan were conducted by the volunteers, they cleaned the campsite and college campus. A significant event of the day was an awareness programme on Thalassemia by Abhijit Sarkar, Thalassemia Control Unit, Krishnagar, Nadia, which was well-received by the volunteers. After awareness programme was over a thalassemia detection camp was also conducted, where 52 samples were collected from students and adopted community members. We extend our special thanks to Dr. Chanchal Mandal for conducting the detection camp. The day's activities also included a practice session for cultural activities and feedback collection from NSS volunteers. The programme concluded with the NSS Flag being lowered by Lt. Sujan Debnath.

Report on Day 3 – 10 April 2026, Friday

Session-wise Summary:

Session I (10:00 a.m.): Yoga & Meditation

The day began with a Yoga and Meditation session. This activity, led by Uttam Kr. Barman, aimed to enhance physical wellbeing, mental clarity, and stress management among participants. Volunteers practiced various yoga postures and meditation techniques, fostering a sense of calm and focus to start the day.

Session II (11:00 a.m.): AI Training Program & Job Opportunities

Vision India Service Private Limited conducted a session on Artificial Intelligence (AI) training and job opportunities. The session introduced participants to the basics of AI, its applications in various industries, and emerging career paths. Practical insights were provided on how students can prepare for AI-related roles, including recommended skills and resources. This session was particularly valuable for students considering future employment in technology sectors.

Session III (12:00 p.m.): Hands-on Training on Viksit Bharat & My Bhart Portal

Dr. Mahaprasad Ghosh, Programme Officer of the NSS Unit, led a practical training session on the 'Viksit Bharat' initiative and the 'My Bhart Portal.' Volunteers learned how to navigate the

portal, access resources, and contribute to national development goals. The hands-on approach ensured that participants could apply their learning in real-world contexts.

Session IV (3:00 p.m.): Cultural Programme

The day concluded with cultural activities such as singing, dancing and recitation.

Report on Day 4 – 11 April 2026, Saturday

Session-wise Summary:

Session I (10:00 a.m.): Swachh Bharat Abhiyan

The day began with a Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (Clean India Mission) activity in the adopted village. Volunteers participated in cleaning drives, raising awareness about cleanliness and hygiene among village. This initiative aimed to instill the importance of a clean environment and set a positive example for the community.

Session II (11:00 a.m.): Community Interaction & Field Survey

Volunteers engaged in direct interaction with community members and conducted a field survey. This activity helped identify local needs, challenges, and opportunities for development. The survey data would be valuable for planning future interventions and ensuring that the camp's efforts align with the community's priorities.

Session III (12:00 noon): Motivational Speech about Blood Donation

Mr. Babar Ali Shaikh, a motivational speaker, delivered an inspiring talk on the importance of blood donation. He addressed common myths, highlighted the lifesaving impact of voluntary blood donation, and encouraged both volunteers and villagers to participate in future blood donation drives.

Session IV (1:00 p.m.): Awareness Programme on HIV/AIDS and Health & Hygiene

Mr. Babar Ali Shaikh also led an awareness session on HIV/AIDS and general health and hygiene. The session covered modes of transmission, prevention strategies, and the importance of regular health check-ups. Emphasis was placed on breaking stigma and promoting open discussions about health issues.

Session V (3:00 p.m.): Practice for Cultural Programme

The day concluded with practice sessions for upcoming cultural programmes, including short plays and processions. These activities aimed to prepare volunteers for effective community outreach through creative and engaging performances.

Report on Day 5 – 12 April 2026, Sunday

Session-wise Summary:

Session I (10:00 a.m.): Community interaction

The fifth day began with community interaction at the adopted village. Volunteers interacted with local residents and participated in activities designed to strengthen the relationship between the college and the community.

Session II (11:00 a.m.): Health, Hygiene & First-Aid Management

A Health and Hygiene programme with First-Aid Management was organised with the support of Student Health Home. The programme provided useful knowledge regarding basic first aid and health and hygiene practices.

Session III (12:00 noon): Free Medical Camp & Blood Group Testing

A Free Medical Camp was subsequently organised, including health check-up and blood-group testing, with the support of Student Health Home, Krishnanagar Branch.

The day concluded with practice for the forthcoming cultural programme.

Report on Day 6 – 13 April 2026, Monday

Session I (10:00 a.m.): Cleanliness drive

The sixth day began with a cleanliness drive at the camp premises.

Session II (11:00 a.m.): Tobacco Control Programme

A National Tobacco Control Programme was conducted by the District Tobacco Control Cell, DHFW. The programme focused on creating awareness regarding the harmful effects of tobacco consumption and the importance of a healthy, tobacco-free lifestyle.

Session III (12:00 noon): Quiz Competition

A Quiz Competition on “Viksit Bharat & Drug Free India” was organised to encourage the volunteers to develop knowledge and awareness about national development and the prevention of substance abuse.

The day ended with practice for the cultural programme.

Report on Day 7 – 14 April 2026, Tuesday

Creativity, Cultural Programme and Valedictory Ceremony

The final day of the Special Camp began with a Drawing Competition for Primary School Children aged 8–12 years. The programme encouraged children to express their creativity and participate actively in the camp.

A cultural competition among different groups was organised subsequently. NSS volunteers demonstrated their talents through various cultural activities.

The programme concluded with the Valedictory and Closing Ceremony. The concluding session reviewed the activities undertaken during the seven-day camp and acknowledged the participation and contribution of the NSS volunteers, teachers, resource persons and community members.

Conclusion

The NSS Special Camp 2025–2026 was a comprehensive, seven-day, community-oriented programme combining cleanliness, health awareness, education, digital literacy, social awareness, cultural activities and community interaction. The activities provided the NSS volunteers with opportunities to work closely with members of the adopted village and to understand their needs and concerns.
