FACILITIES

College library: With more than 5000 books in stock, along with reference material, national dailies and periodicals, the library is an active hub of learning and pursuing careers. There is ample sitting arrangement for teachers and students. A campus LAN, a subscription to INFLIBNET, an online cataloguing system and several internet-linked computers enable library users to access enormous digital resources.

Students' Health Home: Since inception, the college is a member of the Students Health Home: students are entitled to get medical assistance from the District Students Health Home located at Krishnagar, and from the state level centre of the Students Health Home in Kolkata. The students, especially the poor and the needy, are requested to take advantage of this for free treatment.

Cultural activities: On the cultural front, the college has been displaying creativity and verve since initiation. The Students' Union organizes social cultural function and fresher's welcome, blood donation camps, teachers' day and cultural competitions. Apart from these, students regularly participate and have won prizes in Youth Parliament Competitions and Quiz competitions outside the college. The college observes its Foundation Day (July 28) and days of national and international importance. Departmental seminars and workshops happen on a regular basis.

Students Union: Like any other college our institution also has provision for Students' Union, the elections for which is held maintaining the rules and regulations of the University of Kalyani. The Students Union is an integral part of the college and functions as the help desk for students by assisting them generally as well as taking the demands of the students forward.

Stipend and other scholarships: All efforts are made on the part of this college so that students can avail of various government and non-government scholarships like **Jindal Foundation Scholarship, Swami Vivekananda Scholarship, Kanyashree Scholarship, Minority Scholarship, SC, ST, OBC-B Scholarship** etc. For availing scholarships students must apply through proper channel within the stipulated date announced on the college notice board. The college awards '**Madan Mohan Tarkalankar scholarship**' to students on the basis of Midterm result and class attendance (one student from each department will be provided a 6-month scholarship, and another a 4-month scholarship). College will provide **Best Result Award** for students on the basis of their performance in the University Examinations.

Disciplinary Issues:

Eligibility as per University Regulations

1. **A.** For an Honours Course, a general candidate must have 45% marks in his/her best five subjects and must have at least 55% marks in the relevant subject, or 50% in aggregate and 45% in the relevant subject, or 55% in aggregate when there is no relevant subject. SC/ST candidates shall enjoy 5% relaxation in all the above categories.

B. In case of the General/Programme Course whereas general candidates must have 45% in aggregate SC/ST candidates must have at least 40% (200) marks in the best five subjects and 50 marks in the relevant subjects.

2. Core Course students can opt for Physical Education as a Generic Elective subject, provided they qualify in physical fitness test. This is also mandatory for students of Physical Education (Gen.)

3. The seats in Education and Philosophy are limited and the seats will be filled in following the merit panel.

4. For each Core Course and Physical Education the students have to apply in different prescribed forms.

General Rules Regarding Admission

1. A candidate may get admitted to three year (six semester) B.A Degree course after passing the H.S examination in general or vocational stream conducted by the WBBHSE or an equivalent examination conducted by other Board/Council/Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya/National Open School by the Distance Learning Council.
2. In case of other boards a candidate has to qualify in five recognized subjects, of which one shall be English of full marks not less than 100.
3. Candidates from vocational stream or open school will be allowed admission to General and Major Courses only.
4. Candidates will be allowed to get admitted within three consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the qualifying examination.
5. Candidates must apply for admission in the prescribed form available on the college website.
6. Students have to choose subjects from the list of subjects provided by the college. However, the subjects should preferably be chosen from the H.S subjects.
7. The candidates desiring to take admission in this college, if admitted to any other college hereafter, have to submit admission cancellation certificate within the prescribed time.
8. Students have to collect and use College Identity Card within the college premises.
9. Students have to pay their fees within 15th of the respective month; else they have to pay the fine amount along with the fees. At the time of admission, however, students have to pay the fine amount along with fees. At the time of admission, however, students have to pay for upcoming three months at a time. **Above 60% attendance will be treated as Collegiate, 50-60% Non-Collegiate and students with below 50% attendance will be treated as Dis-Collegiate.**
10. There is a six-month Computer Literacy Course in the college. The course fee is Rs. 230.00.
11. For students residing permanently in a different locality the mentioning of the Local Guardians in the prescribed format is mandatory.
12. No student is allowed to take admission in more than one Core Course (Hons After taking admission to a discipline one should have to pay the complete fees again to get admission in another subject. The paid fee amount is non-refundable and non-transferable.

13. Students taking admission to the Physical Education (General) course must deposit Rs. 1000 towards the cost of course costume.
14. Until the completion of University Registration, one is not considered to be a student of the college or University. If a student is found with different registrations, his/her candidature will be cancelled.
15. Admission Panel will be framed on the basis of the obtained marks in the H.S or equivalent examination. Where there is no Aggregate Number, the Best of Five subject's marks will be considered. For SC/ST/PH students there will be reservations in keeping with the government rules.

Documents (in original) to be produced at the time of admission:

1. MP Admit Card/Birth Certificate/MP Certificate
2. H.S or equivalent mark sheet
3. Two copies of colored photograph (one passport size, one stamp size)
4. SC/ST Certificate (students with no caste certificate will have to produce the Entitlement Card issued during the H.S and a certificate from the Chairman of the Municipality/Zila Parishad Sabhadhipati/Panchayat Samity Sabhadhipati)
5. School leaving Certificate (to be submitted in original at the time of the admission)

Documents to be submitted with the application (self-attested copies):

1. Admit Card and Mark sheet of MP
2. Mark sheet of H.S Examination
3. Caste Certificate(those who do not have caste certificate will have to submit the Entitlement Card issued during the H.S and in original a certificate from the chairman of the Municipality/Zila Parishad Sabhadhipati/Panchayat Samity Sabhadhipati)
4. Attach a color photograph in the specified space in the Application Form.
