College library

The college has a central library with about seven thousand books apart from departmental seminar libraries run by the departments. Access to online resources is made possible through internet-linked, and LAN-connected computers for all library users, as well as remote access link to the catalogues provided on the college website. The library catalogue or OPAC uses an updated library software to keep readers abreast of availability of titles and journal issues. With a comfortable reading zone divided between faculty and students, the library caters also to digital activity – an institutional subscription of INFLIBNET opens for all a wide vista of current research articles that may be accessed even from homes. The library is currently building up a store of digitalized books and open access platforms across the web.

The central library is also a hub of career opportunities. National dailies, employment bulletins, periodicals of a general nature, and journals on various specialized subjects offer the student both an updated scenario of the job market and in depth knowledge on current and debated issues of national and international importance. The library also contains a corner for career counseling and assistance through the Placement Cell.

Facilities for Girl Students

The college houses a Girls' Common Room with separate toilets and a sanitary vending machine, and there is an alert and prompt grievance redressal mechanism for gender-related issues and complaints through the Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell, Womens' Cell, Internal Complaints Committee, Anti-ragging Squad etc. The Womens' Cell regularly monitors the sanitation facilities and arranges various educational/counselling programs addressing the on/off campus problems faced by the girl student.

Students' Health Home

Since inception, the college is an institutional member of the Students' Health Home, enabling students to get medical assistance from the District Students' Health Home located at Krishnagar and from the state level centre of the Students' Health Home in Kolkata at a minimal cost. In the past, such medical aid has come to great help to our students, particularly to the poor and the needy. This apart, experts from the Home conduct periodical health check-up, blood donation, thalassaemia testing, first aid training camps and workshops where students can learn these life skills at no cost at all.

Cultural activities

On the cultural front the college has shown great progress in its initial years. Under the guardianship of the Cultural Subcommittee, students hold out a rich panorama of music, dance, quiz, recitation, dramatic performance etc. round the year on the occasions of Social Program and Freshers' Welcome where the students' union also participates. The Teachers' Council organizes an annual cultural competition in music, painting, recitation and dance, for which prizes are awarded. The college takes part in the District Level Youth Parliament Competition with distinction. Days of national and international importance like the Republic Day or the World Yoga Day, and commemorative events like Rabindra Jayanti or Tarkalankar Day are observed with cultural performances.

Scholarships

The college offers all the scholarships provided by the Government to proper recipients sanctioned by rules laid down for each, such as Kanyashree, Swami Vivekananda, SC, ST, OBC, Chief Minister's Relief Fund etc. along with non-government scholarships from the Jindal Foundation, and Mahindra. On its own, the college runs the Madan Mohan Tarkalankar Merit Scholarship, provided to students on the basis of meritorious performance in the university examinations. The college office offers complete assistance to the students availing of these scholarships, many of which are transacted online.

National Service scheme (N.S.S)

The college is happy to announce that in the session 2012-13 the NSS unit has been formed in the college, with due permission and financial assistance from government and the University of Kalyani. The unit was formally inaugurated with an AIDS/HIV awareness programme on AIDS day. The day also marked the opening of the Red Ribbon Club in the college. Whereas the NSS unit of the college aims to undertake the responsibility of spreading awareness of the various social evils and health problems in the rural periphery of the college, the Red Ribbon Club has single objective of making people aware of the menacing disease called AIDS.

Sports and games

The college can boast of a robust sporting tradition and believes in the moral, ethical, physiological, and professional benefits of sports. A large playground is used for football, cricket and athletics, while separate courts for volleyball, badminton and Kho Kho exist. The college maintains a steady supply of sporting equipment and nurtures sporting infrastructure, and plans to set up a gymnasium in the near future. The Department of Physical Education runs Yoga and Gymnastic trainings, and leads the college in athletic and sporting meets both intramural and extramural. Regular participation in University and DPI meets have brought glorious medals, and many students produced by this network find employment in the Sports Quota in various sectors.

Students' Union

As part of its organogram, the college has an Autonomous Students' Union, to which students' representatives are annually elected through a general election conducted along rules and regulations set down by the affiliating university. The Union is an integral stakeholder of the college and functions round the year in various facilities: assisting students in academic and co-curricular issues and problems, participating in decision-making through committees on sports, culture, complaints, ragging, sexual harassment, women etc. and maintaining gender and religious/communal harmony in the campus. Representatives of the students' union are members of the Governing Body and the IQAC.

Academic Mobility

The college runs three-year programs in a semesterized system providing Honours and Program degrees in CBCS (Choice based credit system) curriculum since 2018, where ample academic mobility is offered in the form of pools of Core, Generic Elective, Discipline Specific Elective, Skill Enhancement and Ability Enhancement courses from which students may choose according to their will. The affiliating university registers students with their free choices on admission and offers choices at later points in the semesterized system.

Necessary Facts for Admission to B.A 1st Semester:

Reservation of seats during admission to the first semester is done as per following government rules: SC-22%, ST-06%, OBC(A)- 10%, OBC(B)-07%, Physically Challenged-03%, Sports Quota-one seat per Honours subject, and in physical Education.

General Facts

A candidate may get admitted to three year (six semester) B.A Degree course after passing the H.S examination in general or vocational stream conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by the other Board/Council or Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya or National open school by the Distance Learning Council.

1. In case of other boards a candidate has to qualify in five recognized subjects, of which one shall be English of full marks not less than 100.
2. Candidates from vocational stream or open school will be allowed admission to Program Courses only.
3. Candidates will be allowed admission only within three consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the qualifying examination.
4. Candidates must apply for admission in the prescribed form provided on the college website/admission portal.
5. Students have to choose subjects from the list of subjects provided by the college. However, the subjects should preferably be chosen from those studied at the earlier level.
6. Students have to submit the school leaving certificate in original at the time of verification.
7. The candidates desiring to take admission in this college, if admitted to any other College hereafter, have to submit admission cancellation certificate within the prescribed time.
8. Students have to collect and use college Identity Card within the college premises.
9. Students must abide by the rules and regulations of the college.

10. Students have to pay their fees within 15th of the respective month; else they have to pay the fine amount along with the fees. At the time of admission, however, students have to pay for upcoming three months at a time. Above 60% attendance will be treated as Collegiate, 60-50% Non-Collegiate and students with below 50% attendance will be treated as Dis-Collegiate.
11. For the loss of Identity card, Fees Book, Library Card etc, the duplicate is issued against Rs.30/-
12. For the outsider students the mentioning of the Local Guardians in the prescribed format is mandatory.
13. Until the completion of University Registration, one is not considered to be a student of the college or the affiliating University. If a student is found with different registrations, his/her candidature will be cancelled.

Rules for the Admission in Semesters (as per the University Regulation):

After the completion of each Semester Examination, the students have to get admission within 15 days, else they have to pay fine and will not be allowed to attend class in general procedure. The college will not bear the responsibility of their future admission, University Examination and form fill-up.

University Rules for Final Examination Form fill-up

- 1) The form fill up will be done as per scheduled date of the university. The college will not be responsible for any student who fails to fill up the form within the scheduled date.
- 2) To appear in the University Examination as a regular student, one must have 75% attendance in the class. Students with less than 75% attendances but more than 60% attendances will be treated as Non-collegiate students and only after the payment of Non-collegiate fees the students will be allowed to sit for the exam. Students with less than 60% attendance will be treated as Dis-collegiate and they will not be allowed to sit for the University Examination.
- 3) One must take Clearance certificate from the library before filling up the form for University Exam.
- 4) Students from the poorer section of the society are assisted by the College in relation to the payment of the monthly fees. However, no such assistance will be given to the students who received stipended from any Government or Non-Government Organizations.

Disciplinary Issues

- 1) Loitering in the office premises and near the staff room is strictly prohibited.
- 2) The rules and regulations announced time to time by the college authority will have to be abided by the students
- 3) The students will be considered as part of the college till the publication of the final examination result.
- 4) Absence in any examination in the college will be considered as a violation of discipline and any exception should be explained with proper documentation.
