Internal Quality Assurance Cell

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college was established in November 2013 in accordance with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC). Since its inception, the IQAC has been actively working to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution. The college successfully completed NAAC accreditation in its second cycle under the guidance of the IQAC. The cell regularly undertakes initiatives related to teaching-learning, faculty development, student support, and overall institutional growth.

College Library

The college has a central library with about eight thousand books apart from the departmental libraries. Access to online resources is provided through internet-enabled and LAN-connected computers for all library users, as well as remote access links to the catalogues provided on the college website. The library catalogue or OPAC uses an updated library software to keep readers abreast of the availability of titles and journal issues.

Facilities for Girl Students

The college has a Girls' Common Room with separate toilets and a sanitary vending machine. An active grievance redressal mechanism is also in place to address gender-related issues and complaints through the Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell, Women's Cell, Internal Complaints Committee, and Anti-Ragging Squad.

The Women's Cell regularly monitors sanitation facilities and organizes educational and counselling programmes addressing various on-campus and off-campus issues faced by girl students.

Students' Health Home

The college is an institutional member of the Students' Health Home, enabling students to receive medical assistance from the District Students' Health Home at Krishnagar and the state-level centre in Kolkata at a minimal cost. In the past, such medical assistance greatly benefited students, particularly those belonging to economically weaker sections.

Cultural activities

The college actively promotes cultural activities throughout the academic year. Under the guidance of the Cultural Subcommittee, students participate in music, dance, quiz, recitation, and dramatic

performances on the occasions of Social Program and Freshers' Welcome where the students' union also participates. The Teachers' Council organizes annual cultural competitions in music, painting, recitation, and dance, where prizes are awarded to successful participants.

National and international days such as Republic Day and International Yoga Day, along with commemorative occasions like Rabindra Jayanti and Tarkalankar Day, are observed in terms of various cultural programmes and performances.

Scholarships

The college offers all the scholarships provided by the Government to proper recipients sanctioned by rules laid down for each, such as Kanyashree, SVMCM, SC/ST/OBC, Aikyashree, Chief Minister's Relief Fund, etc. On its own, the college runs the Madan Mohan Tarkalankar Merit Scholarship, provided to students on the basis of meritorious performance in the university examinations. The college office offers complete assistance to the students availing of these scholarships, many of which are transacted online.

National Service Scheme (N.S.S)

The college is proud to run an active unit of the National Service Scheme (NSS), established with the approval and support of the Government and the University of Kalyani. The NSS unit plays a vital role in promoting social awareness, community engagement, and the holistic development of students through various extension and outreach activities.

As part of its community outreach initiatives, the NSS unit has adopted the nearby village of Daspara, where volunteers regularly conduct awareness campaigns and social service activities for the welfare of the local community. These activities help students develop leadership qualities, social responsibility, and a spirit of community service.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The college is proud to have an NCC unit that encourages students to develop discipline, leadership, self-confidence, and a sense of national integration. Through regular training and various NCC programmes and activities, cadets are motivated to cultivate responsibility, teamwork, and physical fitness. The NCC unit also provides opportunities for students to attend camps and participate in activities at different levels.

Sports and Games

The college can boast of a robust sporting tradition and believes in the moral, ethical, physiological, and professional benefits of sports. A large playground is used for football, cricket and athletics, while separate courts for volleyball, badminton and Kho Kho exist. The college maintains a steady supply of sporting equipment and nurtures sporting infrastructure, and plans to set up a gymnasium in the near future. The Department of Physical Education & Sports runs Yoga and Gymnastic trainings, and leads the college in athletic and sporting meets both intramural and extramural. Regular participation in University and DPI meets have brought glorious medals, and many students produced by this network find employment in the Sports Quota in various sectors.

Academic Mobility

Since 2023, the college has been offering four-year semesterized programmes with multiple entry and exit options under the NEP 2020 curriculum introduced by the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal. The curriculum followed by the University of Kalyani offers academic flexibility through Major, Minor, Multidisciplinary, Skill Enhancement, and Ability Enhancement components, allowing students to pursue their academic interests and career goals through an interdisciplinary approach. Students are also encouraged to register under the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system introduced under NEP 2020.

Admission Rules and Regulations

1. Admission to undergraduate programmes is conducted strictly according to the rules and regulations of the University of Kalyani and the Government of West Bengal under the NEP 2020 framework.
2. Candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary Examination or its equivalent from a recognized Board/Council are eligible for admission, subject to fulfillment of the prescribed criteria.
3. Students are required to complete the admission process through the online admission portal (WB Centralised Admission Portal- <https://wbcap.in>) within the stipulated time.
4. Original documents and testimonials must be produced for verification whenever required by the college authority.
5. Students must carry and produce their College Identity Card while on campus.
6. Students are expected to maintain discipline and abide by the rules and regulations of the college.
7. Attendance rules and fee regulations shall be governed by University and Government norms.

1. Laboratory fee for Geography Minor: Rs. 500/- (payable after admission to the college).
2. Transfer Fee: Rs. 200/-.
3. Admission fees shall be refunded according to Government and University rules after deduction of the prescribed cancellation charges, provided the application for cancellation is submitted within the stipulated period.

Rules for University Examination Form Fill-up

1. Examination form fill-up shall be conducted according to the schedule notified by the University. The college will not be responsible for any student failing to complete the form fill-up process within the stipulated dates.
2. To appear in the University Examination as a regular student, a minimum of 75% attendance is required. Students having attendance below 75% but above 60% shall be treated as Non-Collegiate students and will be allowed to appear in the examination only after payment of the prescribed Non-Collegiate fees. Students having attendance below 60% shall be treated as Discollegiate and will not be allowed to appear in the University Examination.
3. Students must obtain a clearance certificate from the library before filling up the University Examination form.
4. The college extends financial assistance to students belonging to economically weaker sections of society in relation to the payment of monthly fees. However, such assistance is generally not provided to students receiving stipends or scholarships from Government or non-government organizations.

Disciplinary Rules

1. Loitering near the college office and staff room is strictly prohibited.
2. Students must abide by the rules and regulations announced by the college authority from time to time.
3. Students shall be considered members of the college until the publication of the final examination results.
4. Absence from any college examination shall be treated as a disciplinary matter unless supported by proper documentation.

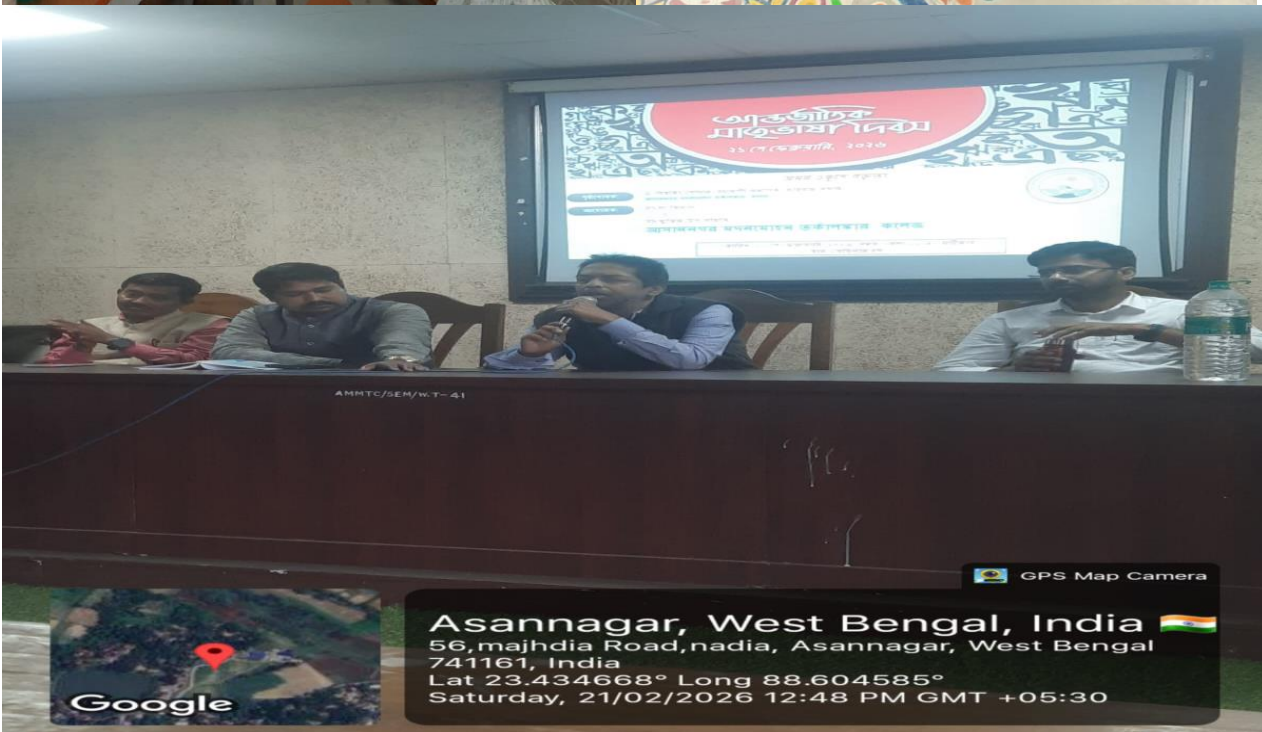

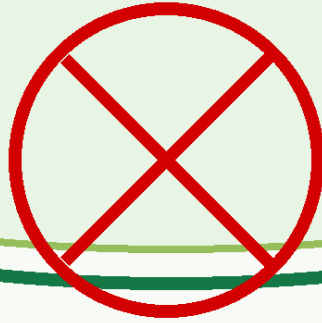
