REPORT ON THE ONE-DAY NATIONAL SEMINAR ON

“LEGACY OF DR. SYAMA PRASAD MOOKERJEE: EDUCATION, NATION-BUILDING AND BEYOND”

A One-Day National Seminar on “Legacy of Dr. Syama Prasad Mookerjee: Education, Nation-Building and Beyond” was organized by the NSS Unit and IQAC of Asannagar Madan Mohan Tarkalankar College, Asannagar, Nadia, West Bengal, on 18 August 2026. The seminar was conducted in blended mode at the Smart Class Room of Asannagar MMT College.

The inaugural session commenced with the felicitation of the dignitaries, followed by the lighting of the ceremonial lamp by the Teacher-in-Charge and other dignitaries. The inaugural proceedings also included Vedic mantra chanting by Sri Soumen Pal, Assistant Professor, Department of Philosophy. The welcome address was delivered by Dr. Biswajit Podder, Teacher-in-Charge, Asannagar MMT College. The inaugural session concluded with the address by the Chief Guest, Shri Shailesh Kumar Rai, Youth Officer, Regional Directorate of NSS, Kolkata, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, delivered online.

The first technical session began with the Keynote Address delivered by Prof. Bimal Sankar Nanda, Former Associate Professor, on the topic “Syama Prasad and the Creation of West Bengal: In-search of a True History.” The session subsequently featured a scholarly presentation by Dr. Rajib Lochan Mohapatra, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, University of Burdwan, on “The Beyond Politics Aspect of Syama Prasad Mookerjee: A Bird's Eye View.” The session was chaired by Dr. Chirantan Sarkar, Assistant Professor, Department of English, with Dr. Rezwan Ahmed, Assistant Professor, Department of English, serving as Co-Chairperson. A question-and-answer session followed the presentations, providing scope for academic interaction and discussion.

The **second technical session** comprised two significant scholarly presentations. Dr. Prosenjit Bose, Assistant Professor, Department of Bengali, Balagarh Bijoy Krishna Mahavidyalaya,



delivered a presentation online on “বাংলা, বাঙালি ও শ্যামাপ্রসাদ”। The session was chaired by Sri Partha Banerjee, Assistant Professor, Department of History, with Dr. Prokash Biswas, Assistant Professor, Department of Bengali, serving as Co-Chairperson. This was followed by a presentation by Dr. Subhankar Ghosh, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, University of Burdwan, on “From Nation Building to Viksit Bharat@2047: Dr. Syama Prasad Mookerjee’s Educational Vision for Sustainable Development.” The session was chaired by Dr. Nilendu Biswas, Associate Professor, Department of History.

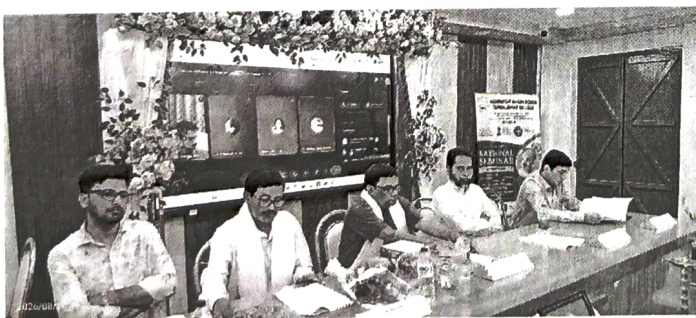
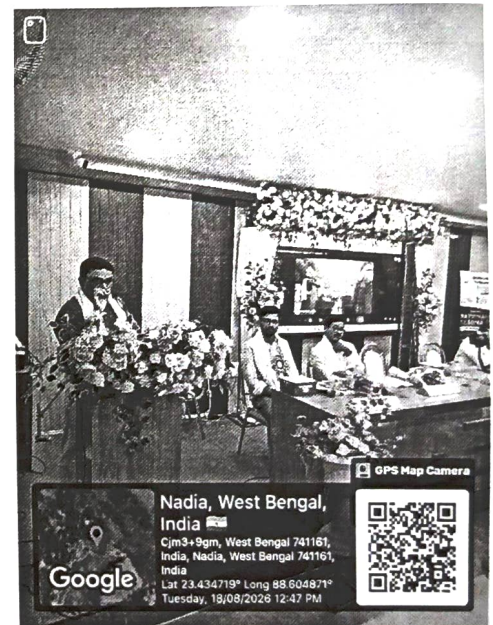
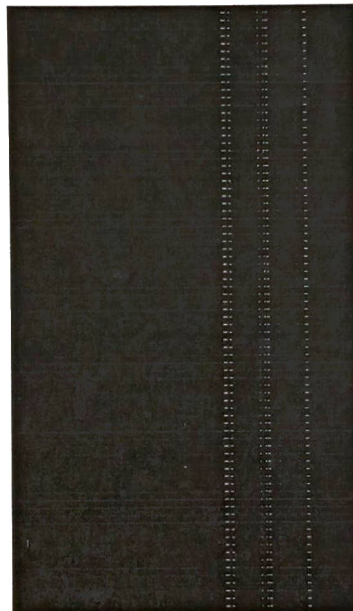
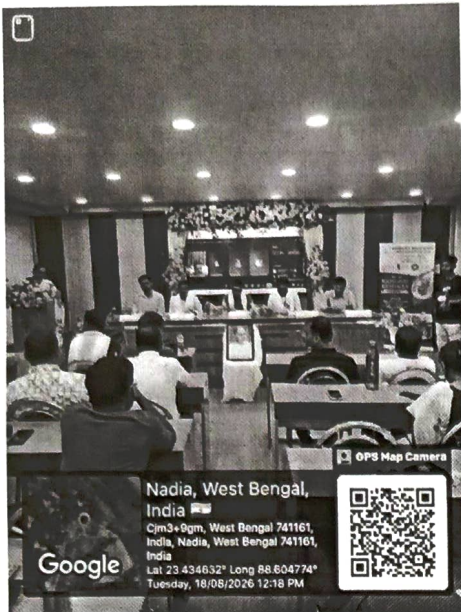
The third technical session further broadened the academic scope of the seminar. A question-and-answer session followed the presentation.

An important component of the seminar was the research paper presentation segment, conducted in both offline and online modes. The offline presentations were held in Room No. 07 (Seminar Hall) under the chairpersonship of Sri Partha Banerjee and co-chairpersonship of Sri Soumen Pal. The online presentations were chaired by Dr. Nilendu Biswas, with Dr. Rezwana Ahmed serving as Co-Chairperson.

A total of 83 participants were registered for the seminar, comprising 34 students, 36 faculty members, and 13 delegates. The participation of students, teachers, researchers, and delegates contributed significantly to the academic interaction and enriched the overall deliberations of the seminar.

The programme was moderated by Smt. Konica Chanda, State-Aided College Teacher, Department of English. The seminar concluded with the Vote of Thanks delivered by Dr. Mahaprasad Ghosh, convenor of this seminar and Programme Officer of NSS Unit, Asnagar MMT College.
